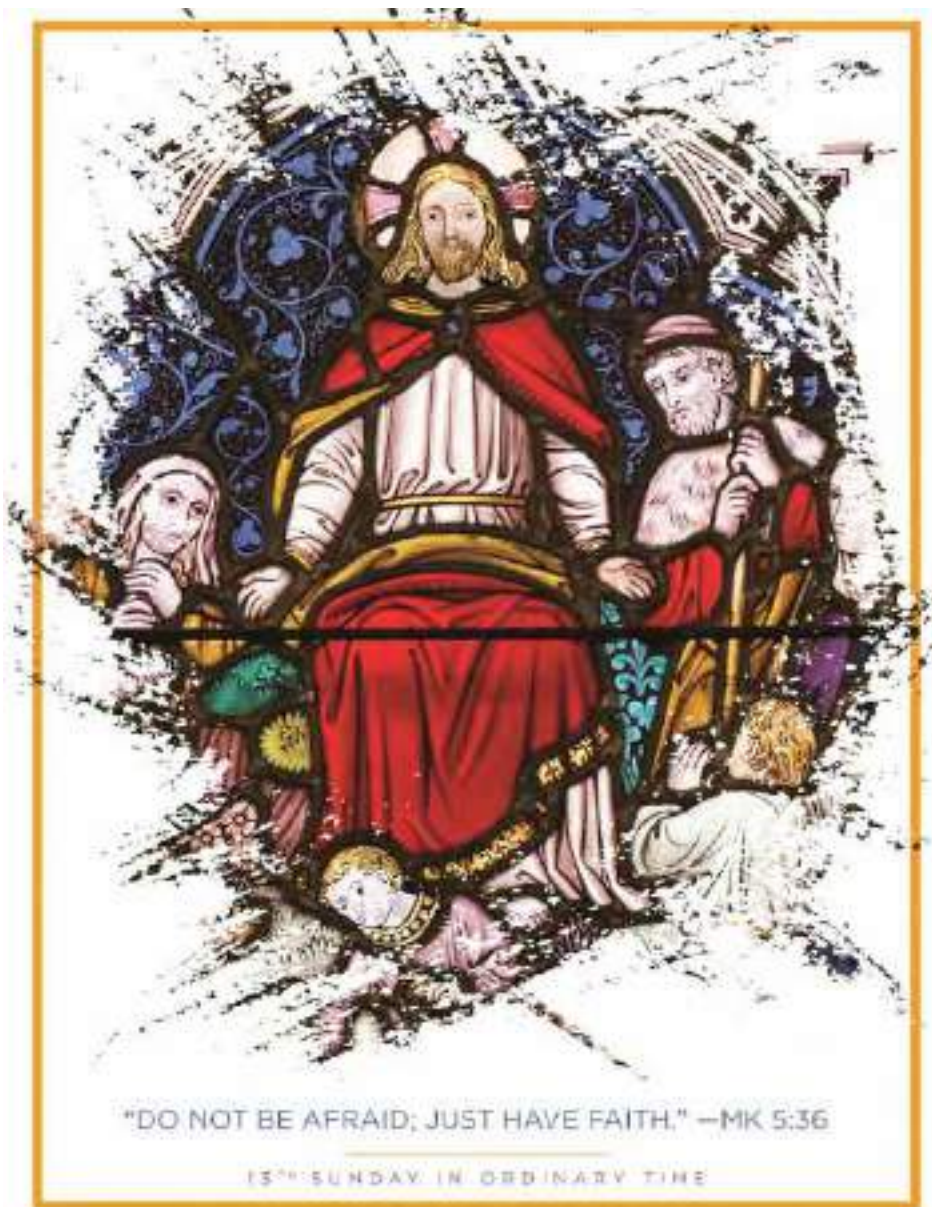

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The first reading sets the tone for the readings this Sunday as it begins, “God did not make death, nor does he rejoice in the destruction of the living.” (Wis 1:13) It is a reminder that God does not do or create evil. He did not make death. We are responsible for the existence of death and evil. Every time we choose something contrary to the will of God we sin, we choose that which does not give life, or that which takes life.

God wants us to be fully alive, he made man and woman in his own image and likeness and made us to be imperishable. Look then how death enters the world, “But by the envy of the devil, death entered the world, and they who belong to his company experience it.” (Wis 2:24) The Devil tempted Adam and Eve, and they went against God’s plan and will, and with that sin and death entered the world. God did not want us to know the pains of sin and death. St. Irenaeus reminds us of this when he says, “The glory of God is the human being fully alive, and the glory of the human is the vision of God.”

Now look at the Gospel, there are two stories of suffering, and one ends in death. Remember just in the passage before, Jesus was asking the disciple about their lack of faith regarding the storm at sea. Now the first story is that of a sick girl, whose father comes to ask Jesus for a healing, and then on the way, another story takes place. The woman with the hemorrhage was healed. Both the woman and the father of the girl see Jesus as the only hope for a cure and the solution to the sufferings at hand. They both have faith.

The woman, in the midst of the crowd touches the hem of Jesus clothes, she knew she would be healed. And she was healed. An amazing thing that is recorded is Jesus felt power leave him at this moment. And he asks who has touched his clothes. He keeps looking even though the disciples try to dissuade him. And the women relate everything that happened, and why she came to Jesus for healing. Jesus tells her, “Daughter, your faith has saved you.”

Sadly, at this moment, some people come to relay that Jairus’ daughter had died. Jesus disregards the report and tells Jairus to have faith. He does, because he still has Jesus come to the house, and there he witnesses as Jesus brings his daughter back to life.

One of the saddest lines in the bible is recorded in another part of the Gospel, “So he was not able to perform any mighty deed there, apart from curing a few sick people by laying his hands on them. He was amazed at their lack of faith.” (Mk 6:4-5) Both the woman and Jairus, had faith and because of this faith they were able to experience the healing that Christ wanted for them.

Jesus calls us to have faith as well. He asks us to believe in him, to believe that he is truly God incarnate. Do we believe in his power to heal even in our time? He does not want us to come to him when all else fails or all seems hopeless. Rather he wants us to have a living relationship with him, and to believe in his power to heal.

He also gives us the means of healing in the sacramental life. In confession he destroys the sins that keep us from his love and forgives us and strengthens us to love. In the Anointing of the Sick there is spiritual healing and even too, there are physical healings. Our sign of faith, our sign of belief the Christ wants us to be fully alive is to use the means of salvation that he has given to us in his Church.

Queridos hermanos y hermanas en Cristo

La primera lectura marca el tono de las lecturas de este domingo, pues comienza así: "Dios no creó la muerte, ni se alegra de la destrucción de los vivos". (Sab 1,13) Es un recordatorio de que Dios no hace ni crea el mal. Él no creó la muerte. Nosotros somos responsables de la existencia de la muerte y del mal. Cada vez que elegimos algo contrario a la voluntad de Dios pecamos, elegimos lo que no da vida, o lo que quita la vida.

Carta Del Párroco

Dios quiere que estemos plenamente vivos, hizo al hombre y a la mujer a su imagen y semejanza y nos hizo imperecederos. Mira entonces como la muerte entra en el mundo, "Pero por la envidia del diablo, la muerte entró en el mundo, y los que pertenecen a su compañía la experimentan"(Sab 2:24) El Diablo tentó a Adán y Eva, y ellos fueron en contra del plan y la voluntad de Dios, y con eso el pecado y la muerte entraron en el mundo. Dios no quiso que conociéramos los dolores del pecado y de la muerte. San Ireneo nos lo recuerda cuando dice: "La gloria de Dios es el ser humano plenamente vivo, y la gloria del ser humano es la visión de Dios."

Ahora mira el Evangelio, hay dos historias de sufrimiento, y una termina en muerte. Recuerda que en el pasaje anterior, Jesús preguntaba a los discípulos por su falta de fe en relación con la tormenta en el mar. Ahora, la primera historia es la de una niña enferma, cuyo padre viene a pedirle a Jesús que la cure, y luego, por el camino, tiene lugar otra historia. La mujer de la hemorragia fue curada. Tanto la mujer como el padre de la niña ven en Jesús la única esperanza de curación y la solución a los sufrimientos que padecen. Ambos tienen fe.

La mujer, en medio de la multitud toca el borde de la ropa de Jesús, sabía que sería curada. Y fue curada. Una cosa asombrosa que se registra es que Jesús sintió que el poder lo abandonaba en ese momento. Y pregunta quién ha tocado sus vestidos. Sigue mirando aunque los discípulos intentan disuadirle. Y la mujer relata todo lo sucedido, y por qué acudió a Jesús en busca de curación. Jesús le dice: "Hija, tu fe te ha salvado".

Lamentablemente, en ese momento, algunas personas vienen a transmitir que la hija de Jairo había muerto. Jesús hace caso omiso del informe y le dice a Jairo que tenga fe. La tiene, porque hace que Jesús vaya a su casa y allí es testigo de cómo Jesús devuelve la vida a su hija.

Una de las frases más tristes de la Biblia se encuentra en otra parte del Evangelio: "Y no pudo hacer allí ningún milagro, aparte de curar a algunos enfermos imponiéndoles las manos. Tanto la mujer como Jairo tenían fe y gracias a ella pudieron experimentar la curación que Cristo quería para ellos.

Jesús también nos llama a tener fe. Nos pide que creamos en Él, que creamos que es verdaderamente Dios encarnado. ¿Creemos en su poder para curar incluso en nuestro tiempo? No quiere que acudamos a él cuando todo lo demás falla o todo parece desesperado. Más bien quiere que tengamos una relación viva con él y que creamos en su poder de curar.

También nos da los medios para curarnos en la vida sacramental. En la confesión destruye los pecados que nos alejan de su amor, nos perdona y nos fortalece para amar. En la Unción de los enfermos hay curación espiritual y también curaciones físicas. Nuestro signo de fe, nuestro signo de creer que Cristo quiere que estemos plenamente vivos es utilizar los medios de salvación que nos ha dado en su Iglesia.

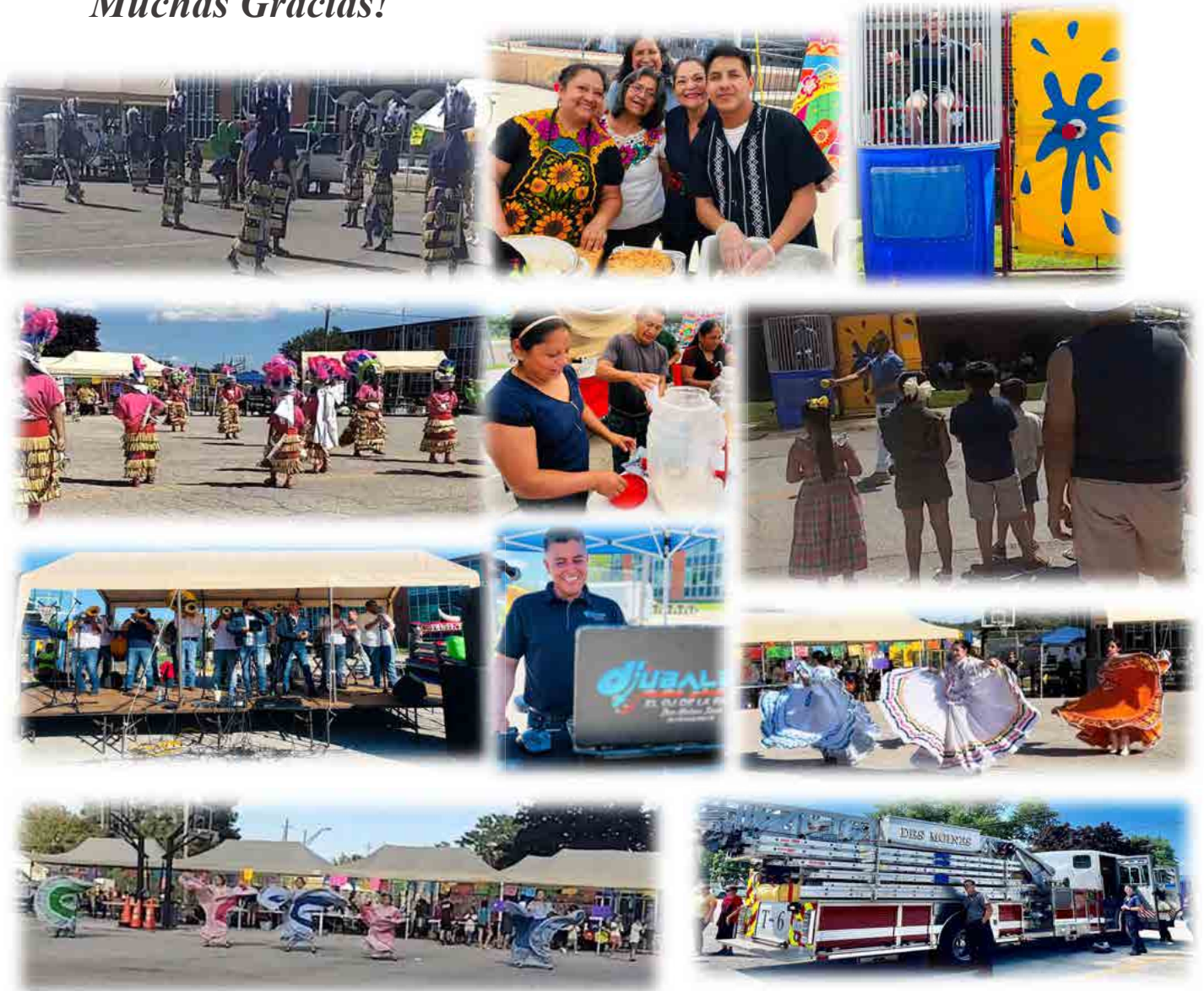

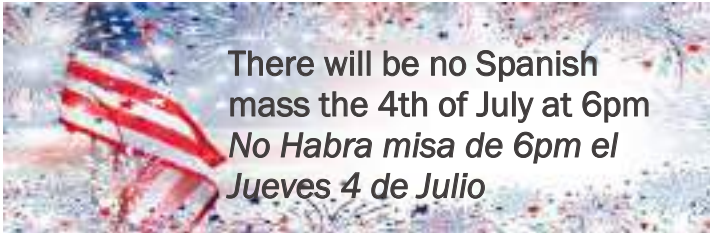
