

Dear Friends, I offer you this short biblical commentary to a question that I encountered my first year in seminary.

During one of my evening classes, in the Spring of 2015, I discovered that a popular interpretation of this miracle is to consider the multiplication of the bread and the fish as a “mere sharing”. The evangelist points out that “the Jewish feast of Passover was near” which means that in the midst of the “large crowd” there might have been some pilgrims who attached themselves to those already following Jesus. It is difficult to imagine that those pilgrims went on a mile-long journey without making any preparations at all. Leading to the interpretation that when they saw Jesus sharing his meager possessions, 5 barley loaves and 2 fish, they too began sharing what they had. Hence the multiplication of the bread and the fish.

Nevertheless, this interpretation lacks biblical foundations because neither John, Matthew or Mark ever mention anything about the people “sharing” their food. Here is some biblical evidence that supports the contrary, that Christ truly multiplied the loaves and the fish. At the beginning of our Gospel today, St. John evokes the figure of Moses in the way that Jesus taught: “Jesus went up on the mountain, and there he sat down with his disciples”. Jesus is the new teacher, the new lawgiver, the one that ascends to the mountain, the new Moses. And like Moses, He wondered how He would feed the vast crowds. His question to Philip “Where can we buy enough food for them to eat” resembles the question asked by Moses of God in the dessert “Where am I to get meat to give to all this people” (Num. 11: 13). Hunger became the occasion for God to show His power, His dominion over nature, His compassion for His people and His generous giving. As with Moses, God once again provided for His people in miraculous ways.

Not only do Moses and Elisha (from our first reading today) stand in the background of this miracle but also the intentionality of our Lord’s dialogue with Philip and the outcome of the miracle. The dialogue opens up with our Lord raising his eyes and noticing a large crowd approaching. He then questioned Philip “Where can we buy enough food for them to eat”? This question was not only a test, but also a logical question because Philip was from that area; it would be like asking a local about the nearest grocery store. From the beginning of this dialogue, our Lord establishes that he intends to feed the crowd and Philip’s answer exposes the difficulty of doing so: we simply do not have the money. The boy then provides the loaves and the fish, and rest is up to Jesus, literally. Unlike the feeding of the four thousand in the Gospels of Matthew and Mark (Mt. 15; Mk. 8), the Gospel of St. John tells us that Jesus did not employ His disciples for the distribution of the bread and the fish. Let alone the crowd.

Once Jesus received the bread and the fish, through His divine power and in union with His heavenly Father, the loaves and the fish were miraculously multiplied to feed the people. It is clear from the dialogue that our Lord’s intention was to feed the “large crowd” and the historically significant number of baskets confirm it: twelve. 12 tribes, 12 disciples, 12 gates of the New Jerusalem, and 12 wicker baskets full of fragments. Furthermore, considering this miracle a “mere sharing” does not explain why the people wanted to crown Jesus at the end of this passage. The reason why they wanted to crown him was because through a “sign” he was able to feed them. This miracle later became a reproach against the crowds when Jesus said “truly, truly, I say to you, you seek me, not because you saw signs, but because you ate your fill of the loaves”. They were not chasing Jesus to have picnics with Him, sharing what they already had, but rather begging for what they didn’t have: food.

In summary, while the idea of “mere sharing” is a noble one, the biblical evidence to support it simply not there. Rather, Christ’s power and compassion came to the aid of our frail humanity to multiply the little we have.



Estimados amigos, les ofrezco este breve comentario bíblico sobre una pregunta que me topé en mi primer año como seminarista.

Durante una de mis clases vespertinas, en la primavera del 2015, descubrí que una interpretación famosa de este milagro era considerar la multiplicación de los panes como un "mero compartir". El evangelista nos informa que ya se acercaba la fiesta judía de la pascua, lo cual significa que entre la muchedumbre que seguía Jesús, quizás se les habían juntado peregrinos que iban rumbo al templo. Es difícil imaginar que estos peregrinos se embarcaron en una caminata de aproximadamente 9 millas sin haberse preparado con comida. Lo cual nos lleva a la interpretación de que cuando vieron a Jesús compartiendo lo poco que tenía, 5 panes y 2 peces, ellos también comenzaron a compartir lo que traían. De este modo se produjo el milagro de la multiplicación de los panes y los peces.

No obstante, esta interpretación carece que fundamentos bíblicos, ya que ni el evangelista Juan, Mateo, ni Marcos hacen mención de que la gente haya compartido sus alimentos. Aquí les ofrezco algunas evidencias que apoyan lo contrario, que Cristo verdaderamente multiplicó los panes y los peces. Al principio de este Evangelio, san Juan evocó la figura de Moisés describiendo cómo Jesús enseñaba: "Jesús subió al monte y se sentó allí con sus discípulos". Jesús es el nuevo maestro, el nuevo dador de la ley, el que sube al monte como Moisés, es el nuevo Moisés. Y como Moisés, también se preguntó cómo iba a alimentar a las multitudes. Su pregunta a Felipe "cómo compraremos pan para que coman estos? " se parece mucho a la pregunta que Moisés le hizo a Dios en el desierto "De dónde voy a sacar carne para dársela a todo este pueblo? " (Num. 11:13). El hambre se convirtió en la ocasión para que Dios manifestara su poder, su dominio sobre su creación, su compasión y su generosidad. Así como con Moisés, Dios proveyó de maneras milagrosas para su pueblo.


No sólo se encuentra Moisés de trasfondo en este milagro, sino también la intencionalidad del diálogo de nuestro Señor con Felipe. El diálogo comienza con nuestro Señor levantando la vista y notando la gente que se acercaba. Entonces, le pregunta a Felipe "Cómo compraremos pan para que coman estos? " Desde el principio del diálogo, nuestro Señor estableció su intención de darle de comer a la gente. Luego el muchacho les trajo los cinco panes y los dos peces, y lo demás le tocó a Jesús, literalmente. A diferencia de san Mateo y san Marcos (Mt. 15; Mc. 8), el evangelio de san Juan nos dice que Jesús no utilizó a los apóstoles para la distribución del pan y los peces. Mucho menos a la gente. Una vez que Jesús recibió los panes y los peces, los multiplicó mediante su poder divino y en unión con su Padre celestial, para darle de comer a la gente.

Más aún, el considerar este milagro como un "mero compartir" no explica por qué la gente quería proclamar a Jesús como rey. La razón por la cual querían proclamarlo rey era porque mediante una "señal milagrosa" pudo alimentar a toda la muchedumbre. Posteriormente este milagro se convertirá en un reproche contra la gente "En verdad, en verdad les digo que ustedes me buscan no porque han visto signos, sino porque comieron pan y quedaron saciados" (Jn. 6:23). No andaban detrás de Jesús para tener "picnics" con Él, para compartir lo que ya tenían. Al contrario, lo perseguían mendigando algo que no tenían: comida. No tiene sentido que lo sigan buscando y lo quieran coronar rey porque les ayudó a "compartir"; lo seguían porque vieron un milagro portentoso con el que le dio de comer a miles de personas.

En resumen, mientras que la idea de compartir es noble, no existe evidencia bíblica que apoye esa interpretación. Más bien, el poder y la compasión de Cristo vinieron a nuestro auxilio para multiplicar lo poco que tenemos.

ST. IGNATIUS LOYOLA | July 31st

This week we celebrate a spiritual master! Not only is St. Ignatius Loyola the founder of the Jesuits, but the legacy of his life of prayer now called Ignatian spirituality inspired believers the world over. Injured as a young soldier, Ignatius spent his time in recovery reading the lives of the saints. They inspired his soul to holy heroism, changing his life forever. Ignatius gathered a group of friends who also desired to be "contemplatives in action," finding God in all circumstances. This became the Jesuits a great missionary and teaching order. Ignatius himself was constantly attuned to his own inner promptings. This self-knowledge open to the movements of the Holy Spirit led him to be an incredibly astute spiritual director. For Ignatius, recognizing God as the first principle of one's life determined everything. How has God changed you?




